Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>The curriculum encompasses multidisciplinary approach and well-articulated with specific objectives that defines the outcome along with the other details such as methodology, assignments, evaluation, reference list and resources. Academic Calendar is prepared at college level by Academic Committee after interacting with the stakeholders namely course coordinators, subject teachers, administrative staff, NSS, cultural and sports head. It includes academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Academic Calendar is shared with the students in person and is also available on website. It is shared at starting of the semester to get a clear idea of examination details, holidays, activities, juries, international seminar, national and international tours, internships etc. To add value to the curriculum delivery at college level, college academic committee emphasizes on micro-planning and macro-planning to make the curriculum most effective. Further the University allows the college to provide value addition/add on courses. Value addition and skill assessment ensures added value to the curriculum as well as enhancing employability of the students. The exhaustive lesson plan gives clarity to students about the teaching learning process and expectations. The faculty has to plan and prepare lesson plan on Edu Cloud - learning management system which provides facilities and information about the repository, time table, lesson plan, attendance, teaching methodology, assignments, hour distribution, and reference based on topics, planning of visits, if any before the commencement of the term, for effective completion of the syllabus which ensures the transparency and fairness in the education system. Detailed lesson plan, syllabus coverage reports and assignments are monitored timely for ensuring quality. The case study based assignments outcome confirms the effective curriculum delivery. Timely assessment of student's work at college and industry level through subject jury confirms the effectiveness in the curriculum delivery. Industry experts are invited to integrate academics to the industry, especially for project based subjects and programs specific electives. College has online book subscriptions and self-created videos (Around 200) which are made available as and when required. The academic committee is responsible to create check points in the form of objective tests and jury by industry/academic expert and students' participation in the academic related competitions. College has supportive systems such as high capacity internet lease line, Google suit and state of art infrastructure that supports the excellent learning environment to ensure effectively in curriculum delivery. Activities such as field trips, study tours, International tours for international exposure, activity based learning are successful tools used to enhance the academic curriculum.</p>
